



## WARRANTY

California Sensor Corporation dba Calsense ("Calsense") warrants to the purchaser of its manufactured products against defects in material and workmanship for a period of five (5) years from the date of original purchase by the owner for product manufactured prior to January 1, 2007, and ten (10) years from the date of original purchase by the owner for product manufactured after January 1, 2007. Manufactured products include all Calsense Irrigation Controllers, Transient Protection Boards, Modular Cards and Terminals, and Calsense enclosures.

All peripheral, accessory, communication devices, RF equipment, and ancillary items such as ET Gages, Flow Meters, and Rain Buckets (but not limited to) and used in conjunction with Calsense Irrigation Controllers, have distinct warranties of their own and should be noted separately from this warranty.

In addition, Calsense warrants 2-Wire decoders and moisture sensors manufactured after January 1, 2007, for a period of five (5) years from the date of original purchase by the owner.

California Sensor Corporation liability is limited solely to the replacement or repair of defective parts.

There are no other express warranties. This warranty does not apply where the equipment is used, or installation performed, in any manner contrary to California Sensor Corporation's specifications and instructions, nor where equipment is altered, modified, misused, or neglected (ants, slugs, animals, vandalism, water damage, unprotected lightning damage, etc.).

California Sensor Corporation is not liable for indirect, incidental or consequential damages in connection with the use of equipment, including but not limited to vegetation loss, property damage, or personal injury from installer's negligence.

### Lightning Warranty

The standard warranty will be extended to cover lightning damage if the controllers and/or 2-Wire decoders installed are in accordance with our installation instructions for each item installed, the National Electrical Code, and the grounding instructions (See the Transient Protection Grounding Section of the Calsense Designers Guide for more information).

## STAINLESS STEEL MAINTENANCE

Stainless steel enclosures exposed to the environment may stain over time. This includes the appearance of "rust" on the enclosure. This stain/rust is not the stainless steel material, which Calsense uses for their stainless steel enclosures, rusting. It is material introduced from the environment. This includes fertilizers, particles in the air, dirt or moisture. Following the simple directions below will lead to many years of satisfactory appearance.

### Stain/rust

- Using a clean Scotchbrite™ pad and WD-40® spray, lightly apply WD-40 spray to the enclosure and wipe with the pad in the direction of the grain. The amount of pressure necessary will depend on how much or long the stain has been allowed to sit on the material.

### Paint or sticker removal

- Use acetone on a clean rag and wipe the metal in the direction of the grain. Once the paint or sticker has been removed go over the area following the stain/rust removal directions listed above.

When you are satisfied with the removal of stain/rust/paint/sticker, you may notice the brushing with the pad has created a "brighter" area on the enclosure. This may be minimized by decreasing the pressure on the pad as you get to the edges, that is, blend the "brighter" area into the rest of the enclosure.

Following these simple steps, as necessary, will keep your Calsense enclosure looking as good as the day it was first installed.
